GENERAL RULES

1. This division is open to all Live Oak County Youth who are entered in public schools in a Kindergarten Class, First Grade Class, Second Grade Class, or Special Ed or Home Schooled and 5 years old prior to September 1 before the fair.
2. Pre-registration is not required for this division.
3. All entries must be the work of the individual exhibitor and will be entered as such. (Not as a class) Items previously entered in the Live Oak County Fair are not to be entered in the **2023** fair.
4. All entries must be delivered to the coliseum at the fairgrounds and registered between **2:00 - 4:00 p.m.** on **Tuesday, February 28**. They **MUST** remain on display until **12:00 Noon** on **Friday, March 3**.
5. Entries must be picked up between **12:00 Noon to 2:00 p.m.** on **Friday, March 3**.
6. The Fair board, the Arts and Crafts Committee or it's agents can NOT be held responsible for loss or damage to any item.
7. There will be a Rosette for each grade level (Kindergarten, First Grade, Second Grade, and Adaptive Ed). The Rosette will be awarded to the highest score in each grade level, provided the top winner score earned a blue ribbon.
8. Blue ribbons will be awarded for First Place, Red ribbons for Second Place and White ribbons for Third Place.
9. No premium money will be awarded.
10. All decisions of the judges will be final.
11. No more than one entry per child per class will be allowed.
